

The Board of Trustees is honored to have the privilege of working with students, parents, staff, faculty, and alumni to further Woodlawn School's mission to produce independent, lifelong learners who are responsible, contributing members of a diverse global society.

Coming out from under the shadow of COVID, we see now more than ever, the importance of developing strength, resilience, and adaptability in our students, working as a community, and building for the future.

As with all private schools, Woodlawn families are encouraged to participate in the community by volunteering, sharing talent and expertise, and generously supporting the 'Blazer Fund and other fundraising efforts. I'm pleased to report that this year our families exceeded expectations in all these areas.

Over the course of the year, students, parents, and alumni contributed over 2000 volunteer hours in the classroom, at school events, and with our community partners. From room parents, field trip chaperones, and athletic teams to special events like STEAMfest, our community's spirit of volunteerism was on display.

More than ever before, Woodlawn parents are engaged in providing expertise and talent to the school community. From teaching elective classes to serving on committees, to mentoring students, these efforts have brought inestimable value.

And once again, you generously supported the 'Blazer Fund with \$234,322.52 in contributions. The 'Blazer Fund provides critical funding above the school's operating budget for special programs, athletic teams, faculty professional development, and tuition assistance programs.

At the annual Gala, the paddle raise collected an amazing \$66,000.00 for "Teacher Wish Lists" and "Campus Beautification Projects." We can report that every teacher's wish list item was fulfilled including a new greenhouse for the garden. And the beautification projects are visible every day on campus including fresh paint, playground updates, new outdoor lunch spaces, and much more.

Last spring, Woodlawn graduated 9 new seniors and sent them on to college where they are well prepared to achieve their goals and live productive and fulfilling lives. We owe a special thanks to the staff and faculty that made this possible. There is no other group that is more committed to our children.

Our community can be proud of these accomplishments. For 20 years Woodlawn has held true to its mission. As we begin the next 20 years we are committed to growing our enrollment, expanding our facilities, and strengthening our community. We invite you to Come Grow With Us!

ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

Each gift to the 'Blazer Fund goes to supporting student success and helping keep the school affordable. This year, charitable contributions to Woodlawn helped us:

- + Fund every item on Teacher Wish Lists, giving our teachers more of the tools and resources they use to support the success of our students.
- + Improve the functionality and beauty of our campus by funding things such as playground renovations, a new gym floor, upgraded HVAC and technology systems, and more.
- + Provide gold-standard professional training and development in Project Based Learning for every Woodlawn teacher.
- + Improve the quality of every child's Woodlawn experience by supporting socio-economic diversity through need-based tuition assistance.
- + Moderate annual tuition increases while investing in excellence. Every dollar donated to the 'Blazer Fund is a dollar we don't have to charge for tuition or reduce our investment in student success.

Nearly all independent schools rely on annual donations because tuition doesn't cover the full cost of educating each child. Woodlawn is no different; we rely on annual donations from our parents, grandparents, alumni, foundations, and friends to fund approximately 10% of our operating budget.

We are good stewards of tuition and 'Blazer Fund dollars:

- + We devote 82% of our budget to salaries and benefits.
- + We invest 8% of our budget to help parents who qualify for need-based tuition assistance afford a Woodlawn education for their children. Our commitment to socio-economic diversity is an integral part of our mission and values.
- + Teaching materials, program costs, operating our campus, and a modest amount for debt service (2%) comprise the rest of our annual spending.


